Facilities & Accommodations

Watson Homestead is a conference center on 600 beautiful acres near Corning, NY. Accommodation options: 1) **Main Lodge:** dorm-style rooms with twin or bunk beds, shared bath; <u>guests must bring sheets and</u> <u>towels</u>, 2) **West Wing:** (attached to Main Lodge) hotel-style rooms with two double beds, private bath and carpeting; all linens (blankets, sheets, towels and pillows) are supplied, 3) **Hillside:** (short walk up a hill from Main Lodge) There may be a limited number of rooms with shared bath in this two-story house; guests must bring sheets and towels. **NOTE:** Watson Homestead is wheelchair accessible.

Schedule

Room assignments will be given starting at 3:30 pm on December 27. Following the evening meal, there will be an introduction of staff, orientation, class registration and activities. The schedule of classes is included with the registration form. Classes begin on December 28 and continue through December 31. The final meal is breakfast on January 1, followed by a closing program.

Descriptions of "full" classes given for four days

Crafts: Decoupage Teri Wilkinson

So, what is decoupage? The art and craft of the papercutter, who uses paper "like a writer uses words" to create something new, adhering with glue any of an endless variety of papers to new surfaces. Your imagination creates the visuals. We will work with the techniques of gluing, layering, sanding and sealing, using hairdryers to aid the drying process. Become an "image pack rat," focusing on a subject as you gather what catches your eyes from calendars, magazines, wallpaper and paint samples, flower and travel catalogs, family photo albums. A variety of boxes, trays, etc., in paper, wood, metal will be provided. You can bring your own, too, as well as scissors, exacto knives, matt knives with snap-off blades, and your curiosity, creativity and enthusiasm. (Ages 11+)

Small Scenes Frank Baskin

Have you wanted to be on stage or try a character different than you? Now's your chance, in front of a supportive group. We will read scenes from real plays, rehearse, put them on for the class, and discuss them afterwards. No prior experience necessary. Class size limited. (Ages 15+)

Descriptions of "mini" classes given for two days

Befriending our Fears - so we can have more of the life we want

How many times have you stopped yourself, believing you were not smart enough, competent enough, young enough, old enough, strong enough, etc., to meet a particular challenge or start down a new path? Given that fear is an inescapable part of our journey, how can we meet our fears, understand where they come from and move on, instead of being held captive by them? Together, through discussion and experiential exercises, we'll explore and imagine the possibilities. (Ages 18+)

Cantina Scene

Howard Moody & Isaac Lebwohl-Steiner An immersive roleplaying experience. During the first day, we learn about a new world and develop our characters. On the second day we enter into a science-fantasy world where all of our characters get to interact. There are very few rules, but a lot of character depth to explore! Note: The Cantina Scene will largely not involve running around and will take place primarily in a single room. (Ages 11+)

Improv

Howard Moody & Isaac Lebwohl-Steiner Let's get together and make it all up! We will play theater games, create mini scenes, and have a lot of fun. This class will have a particular focus on developing characters. It can be a great time by itself or as a companion to the Cantina Scene. No experience or planning necessary. (Ages 11+)

If you have enjoyed the "zentangle" craze and then the coloring book craze, now you can enjoy creating your own kaleidoscopic tessellation! Julie and Dan will guide you through the process of developing radially symmetrical artwork based on one repeating design, similar to a mandala. We will use fine tipped markers and colored pencils to create our masterpieces! (Ages 11+)

Small Scenes for Tweens and Teens

Glenn Lebwohl-Steiner w/ David Geron-Neubauer If you are 10-14 years old this is your chance to taste the delicious flavors of "Small Scenes." Comedy, drama - we have it all! No need to memorize lines; small scripts are provided. You bring your enthusiasm and imagination and a big appetite for exploring, acting, creating characters and working scenes cooperatively. Class size limited. 2 day commitment.
